## y. Public Park Management issues

- i. Relocating boat store in stadium.
  - a. The Dam Safety Works Team will be in the stadium area whilst carrying out their work. This completes in January 2022. There is an opportunity to discuss relocating the boat store in the area vacated by the Dam Safety Team.
  - b. Considerations include:
    - 1. The depth of water and pontoon length.
    - 2. Storage layout.
    - 3. Need to keep travel distances down to a minimum.
- ii. Earlier opening time at 0700 requested, options include:
  - a. Park staff to start work at 0630. Staff will need a contact number to report issues that need to be raised on arrival.
  - b. Time locks. Are there suitable locks available?
  - c. Volunteers to unlock gates. Coordination for three entrances needed. Anecdotal evidence suggests this is likely to be variable.
  - Keep pedestrian gates unlocked. Could be tried for a period of say one month and then reviewed.
- iii. Restitution of the park after events
  - . Pines & Needles and Old Bowling Green areas to be restored from 4<sup>th</sup> May.
- iv. Green Flag Award
  - 1. Application for the 2021 not carried out. An update has been requested to see whether this is on schedule or delayed.
- v. CRC Probation
  - a. The CRC Team are still helping with wood chipping and watering.
- vi. Toilets play area.
  - a. Sanitary bins reinstated.
  - b. LBM funds set aside to improve playground toilets. Drains need to be sorted out first.
  - c. Considering demolishing toilets and relocating to enlarged café in line with LBM Masterplan.
